The Prime Minister of Pakistan is the

political leader and head of <u>qovernment</u> of <u>the country</u>, and is responsible for nominating the rest of the government, chairing Cabinet meetings and deciding when to call general elections for the National <u>Assembly</u>.^[1] The office of prime minister was created immediately after the establishment of Pakistan by the Indian Independence Act 1947. [2][3]

<u>Liaquat Ali Khan</u>, appointed as the first prime minister by the <u>Governor-</u> <u>General</u> in 1947, was assassinated in 1951.^[4] Six further prime ministers served between 1951 and 1958, when the office was dissolved by <u>Iskander</u> Mirza, the President of Pakistan. A later president, Yahya Khan, appointed Nurul Amin as prime minister in 1971, although Amin held the post for only thirteen days.^{[5][6]} Under the <u>1973</u> constitution of Pakistan, the post was recreated and Zulfikar Ali Bhutto became prime minister. Bhutto was overthrown by Muhammad Zia-ul-Haq during Operation Fair Play in 1977, the position was abolished and Zia became Chief Martial Law Administrator.^{[7][8]} Muhammad Khan Juneio was appointed as prime minister by Zia in 1985, and

subsequently dismissed under the <u>Eighth Amendment to the</u> <u>Constitution of Pakistan</u> in 1988.^[5]

Benazir Bhutto and Nawaz Sharif each held the position for two nonconsecutive terms between 1988 and 1999: Bhutto during 1988–90 and 1993–96;^[9] and Sharif during 1990– 93 and 1997–99.^[10] With the thirteenth and fourteenth amendments to the constitution, Sharif became the most powerful prime minister in the country's history.^[11] At approximately five years and four months in total, Sharif is the

longest-serving prime minister.^[2] He was overthrown by <u>Pervez Musharraf</u> in the 1999 <u>military coup d'état</u>.^[12] Sharif was re-elected for a third nonconsecutive term on 5 June 2013, which is a record in the <u>history of</u> <u>Pakistan</u>.^{[13][14]}

The post was empty until <u>Zafarullah</u> <u>Khan Jamali</u> took the office after the <u>2002 elections</u>.^[15] <u>Raja Pervez Ashraf</u> of the <u>Pakistan People's Party</u> was elected on 25 June 2012, after the disqualification of <u>Yousaf Raza Gillani</u> on 19 June 2012 by the <u>Supreme</u> <u>Court of Pakistan</u> over contempt of court.^{[16][17]} Of the twenty-four Prime Ministers who have held office since 1947, eighteen have been elected by the National Assembly, and six have served as <u>caretakers</u>.^{[2][3]}
